## What's the Future for the Presbytery of Pueblo?

This is the question on the mind of many presbyters throughout the country as church memberships have declined and mission support has shrunk. The 219<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (G.A.) took action to provide a means by which presbyteries and synods could restructure, merge or dissolve in-between this year's General Assembly and the next one two years down the road. This Assembly created a "Middle Governing Body Commission" with the power to act as the General Assembly, upon request of presbyteries and synods, to "organize new synods and to divide, unite, or otherwise combine synods or portions of synods...and to approve the organization, division, uniting or combining of presbyteries or portions of presbyteries by synods."

Our current presbytery mission budget is funded in part (8%) by a Mission Partnership Grant from G.A. and the Synod of the Rocky Mountains which this year is \$40,000. But the source of this grant will terminate at the end of 2013. Preparing for this reality, our presbytery is planning to decrease our grant expectation by \$10,000 the next three years and learn to live on monies we generate from our own 26 churches in our presbytery. We realize we will also need to make significant cuts in our total budget so we need to look at staffing, program, ministry and mission costs as we seek to discern God's calling for the next 5-10 years. Toward that end, the Presbytery of Pueblo established a "Future Presbytery Task Force" to consider various models of a faithful and sustainable future for the presbytery. Here are some highlights from the Stated Meeting of July 14, 2010 at Mountain View Presbyterian Church in Colorado Springs:

- Presbytery approved establishing the “**Duane Gould Memorial Fund**” in memory of our Stated Clerk for over 19 years. Contributions can be sent to the presbytery office, payable to “Pueblo Presbytery,” with “Duane Gould Memorial” on the memo line.
- Eight churches were celebrated for **increased worship attendance** during 2009: **Covenant; Gateway; Grace Community; First, Las Animas; First, Pueblo; Del Norte; Salida; San Pablo.**
- Seminary students **Collin Downing** (First, Colo. Springs) and **Andrew Turner** (Covenant) were **moved** from Inquirer status **to Candidacy.**
- The 2011 Mission **Budget** of \$470,226 was **approved.**
